• **How:** Parent & Child takes turns in choosing an object/person/place and the other person has 20 questions to figure out what it is.

	EXAMPLE SKILL AREAS TO TEACH

> Card Games Online: Cardzmania

• How: Create account, set game to private. Options: Solitaire, Trick Cards, Rummy, Crazy Eights, etc.

Guess the Song

How: Parent & Child shares a clip of a song, or sing a song in a silly way and the other person guesses.

> Last Letter

• **How:** Parent & Child chooses category/theme/words. First person chooses a word within that category/theme and says it out loud. Second person say a word using the last letter of the first word.

- How: Parent & Child follows instructions and fills in the blanks, then reads story out loud.

• **How:** Parent & Child both state/write three facts about themselves (2 are true, one is false). Take turns to try and guess which one was the lie.

- **How:** Parent & Child presents two options of preferred/non-preferred situations/items and choose the one they would prefer.

Pictionary

- **How:** Category/theme is chosen, first person comes up with a word/phrase/item to draw from that category/theme while the other person tries to guess what is being drawn as quickly as they can.
 - Optional Word Generator

Scavenger Hunt/Hide and Seek with Toys

- **How:** Custodial can provide a list of common household items and the Custodial will give clues to help the Learner find the items/toys. Can also be played with "hot/cold clues"

• How: Parent & Child takes turns in sharing an item while explaining what it is and why they like it etc.

Simon Says

- **How:** Parent & Child gives instructions/actions to the other person. Instructions that start with "Simon Says..." should be followed, instructions without should not be.
 - Option: Can change "Simon" to any character/person/animal/etc, or use a silly voice

• **How:** Zoom Whiteboard - Open up the whiteboard on zoom and draw the grid. Can change it by adding another row and column to make it more difficult, changing the shapes and/or using the stamp option.

• **How:** Change your scenery or background to help peak the Learners interest. Some examples would be to use a virtual background, go outside, go to a different room, or hang a preferred background/poster.

• **How:** Parent and Child plays music, all involved dances along. Can pause the music and participants freeze when the music stops.

How: Coordinate with Custodial/Provider about places where the Learner can hide (preferably within the same room as the camera).

Magic Tricks

- **How:** Pre-coordinate with Custodial/Provider. See examples below (get creative)
 - Have "wands" or items to magically make a snack, toy, stimuli appear with the Learner. Can also use "magic phrases" (i.e. "Abra Cadabra").
 - Turn camera off and back on so it looks like you have "disappeared". Can have the Learner say the magic word to "make you disappear". Or can have a toy/stuffed animal re-appear so it looks like the technician was changed into something.
 - Using a toy/stimuli: make a cookie and have the parent pre-place a cookie in the oven, after magic word is said, it will "magically appear", and then they will get to eatsnack.
 - Have parent place toy/reinforce in a box or behind back, when technician waves "wand" or says magic phrase the item will "appear" to the Learner.

• **How:** Can play original version with hands over the eyes, you can put up a piece of paper and remove it, or turn the camera off, then on

Puppets

- How: Sock puppet, stuffed animal, kids toy, paper puppet/drawing
 - Can have Custodials go grab extra socks for the Learner as well. Draw or put eyes on a sock to make a puppet. Use a stuffed animal with character or silly voice to present instructions or read a story/tell a story.

Read a Story

- **How:** Read a story either with a real book, an online book, or make up a story. Can be read in a funny/exaggerated tone or character voices.
 - Download Free Kids Books on Apple Books app on iPad (just need to share screen)
 - Storyline Online: Created by Screen Actors Guild with story books read by actors with animated visuals
 - <u>Indianapolis Public Library</u>: 100+ books read aloud with visual animations (some links go to YouTube but the videos will work on Chrome)
 - Storyberries: Picture books with images and text to scroll through, some have audio and videos paired

➤ Making/Sharing a Snack

- **How:** Pre-planned with Custodial/Provider. Make the same snack as the Learner is going to be fed, have caregiver help Learner make or gather the snack items while you do the same.
 - Can also pretend to "share" snack with Learner over the camera, or with favorite stuffed animal. Have Learner share their snack with your stuffed animal friend, etc.

Sing Song

• **How:** Sing kids songs with the Parent & Child. Pair with song movements if applicable. Can also take turns singing lines or portions of the song.

EXAMPLE SKILL AREAS TO TEACH

> Silly Voices

• **How:** Use a silly voice, or character voice to play games, maintain conversations, or give instructions to make it more fun to play. Can also pair with puppets or toys/stuffed animals.

Spirit Week


- How: Pre-plan a spirit or theme week with Custodial, have Parent & Child dress up within that theme;
 watch videos, play games, engage in activities, etc. within that theme. Best done if the Non-Custodial fully engages, dresses up, brings items to sessions.
 - Options: Funny Hats, Superhero Mask, Face paint, sports day, favorite character, wear your favorite color, decades day
